Later successes included saving the Queen Victoria Building, and the Maritime Services Building which now houses the Museum of Contemporary Art. Campaigns to protect all kinds of heritage at risk continue today, as does our commitment to raising awareness of the value of heritage, through education, the annual National Trust Heritage Festival and our National Trust properties which represent significant milestones in the development of the nation

National Trust properties have added to a fascinating and diverse mix of events with special celebrations to share their remarkable stories. A highlight of our own contribution to the Festival is our annual National Trust Heritage Awards, recognised as a leader in encouraging and rewarding excellence in heritage conservation and education.

In its 33rd year, the National Trust Heritage Festival is now celebrated Australia-wide. The National Trust gratefully acknowledges the support of The Heritage Branch of the NSW Office of Environment and Heritage whose continued support since the start has enabled the Festival to grow, and to present some 2,500 events to over one million visitors over the years. 

This beautiful cottage is located on the foreshore of Sugar Loaf Bay in Castlecrag. The original sandstone core was erected in 1883 and was part of the Horsley estate boat building community. This makes the core of this cottage one of the oldest built structures in Willoughby. Last year it received the Award for Best Restoration on a Heritage Property by Willoughby City Council in conjunction with other heritage bodies. The cottage remains the last relic of the Boating Estate, and has been restored in a way that accentuates the built history of the site.

Reconciliation means bringing together Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and non-Indigenous people by building mutual respect and understanding, whilst acknowledging the past and its continuing impact in the present.

Attending a Reconciliation Week event is one way you can learn about and participate in this process. Launched by the Council of Aboriginal Reconciliation in 1998,

Reconciliation Week is held annually between 27 May and 3 June.

27 May marks the successful 1967 Referendum: the day that 90% of Australians voted to change the Constitution to include Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Australians in the census and enable the Commonwealth to make laws concerning them. 3 June is the anniversary of the historic Mabo judgement in 1992. The High Court ruled in favour of Mabo, legally recognising the Native Title land rights of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, and rejecting the myth of terra nullius (that Australia belonged to no one at the time of colonisation). Each year during Reconciliation Week,

Each year during Reconciliation Week, people from across Australia gather to celebrate Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures, and raise awareness about how the broader Australian community can help achieve reconciliation. You can be a part of this too!

The Heritage Council of NSW is established under the NSW Heritage Act, 1977 and is an independent advisory body to Government. Membership of the Council is skills-based, with representation from peak heritage bodies such as the National Trust of Australia (NSW).



The council provides advice on heritage matters to the Minister responsible for heritage in NSW. It recommends to the Minister places and objects for listing on the State Heritage Register (SHR).

The Heritage Council makes decisions about the care and protection of heritage places and items that have been identified as being significant to the people of NSW.

The Council also delivers the NSW Heritage Grants program to help the community to identify, conserve, interpret and promote the State's heritage. Funding is available every two years to individuals, community groups and local government who own or manage heritage items of state significance.

The Heritage Council is serviced by the Heritage Branch, which provides professional advice and administrative support. The Branch also provides advice on heritage issues to the Government, state agencies, local councils and the community on how to protect heritage items.

The work of the Heritage Branch includes:

- working with communities to help them identify their important places and objects;
- · providing guidance on how to look after heritage items;
- supporting local government in the care and management of heritage items;
- managing the Heritage Grants program and changes to heritage items;
- maintaining the NSW Heritage Database, an online list of all statutory heritage items in NSW;
- delivering state-wide Aboriginal heritage, terrestrial archaeology and maritime archaeology programs.

Heritage is evidence of our history. Conserving our heritage helps us to understand our past, and to contribute to the lives of future generations. It gives us a sense of continuity and belonging to the place where we live.
